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Armenian PM to Jerusalem Post: Israel Has Joined Forces With the Devil



JERUSALEM — Israel has lined up with Turkey, terrorists and Syrian mercenaries in backing Azerbaijan in the current conflict with Armenia, and will eventually suffer the consequence of that unholy alliance, Armenian Prime Minister Nikol Pashinyan told The Jerusalem Post in an exclusive interview published on November 3.

Pashinyan, speaking from Yerevan through an interpreter via Zoom, blasted Jerusalem for arming Azerbaijan, which is intent on "carrying out genocide against Armenians in Nagorno-Karabakh."

Answering the question of The Jerusalem Post on whether Armenia is

interested in the humanitarian aid offered by Israel, Pashinyan queried rhetorically: "Humanitarian aid from a country selling weapons to mercenaries who target civilians?"

"I suggest that Israel send this aid to mercenaries and terrorists as a logical continuation of its activities," the Armenian prime minister said.

Armenia recalled its ambassador to Israel for consultations in early October — just two weeks after it opened an embassy in Tel Aviv — to protest arms sales to its enemy.

"I think that Israel should think

Heavy Fighting Continues in Artsakh Hunt for Azerbaijani Subversive Groups Continues

STEPANAKERT — Artsakh Defense forces have reported heavy fighting with Azerbaijani troops attempting to advance in the direction of strategic town Shushi overlooking NKR capital Stepanakert.

In a report disseminated on Wednesday morning the Defense Army announced that Azerbaijani commandos attempted a raid overnight towards the town sitting on a mountaintop some 10 kilometers to the south of Stepanakert, but were stopped in their tracks after meeting resistance from army units and volunteers defending the approaches to the town.

"The advancing group suffered heavy losses and was thrown back," the report said.

"Defense Army units are undertaking search operations along the probable penetration routes of Azerbaijani subversive groups. For this reason, some sections of the Shushi-Berdzor road are temporarily closed for civilians only," the Defense Army said.

"Actions on the encirclement and destruction of the group continue at this moment," it added.

Nagorno-Karabakh's Defense Army also claimed in its report that Azerbaijani forces continued to shell civilian areas. It said there were

wounded people among civilians as a result of the shelling.


On November 3, Armenia's Ministry of Foreign Affairs issued a statement deplored Azerbaijan's continued bombing of the civilian infrastructure in Stepanakert and Shushi with the use of cluster munitions.

It said that the Stepanakert Mother and Child Healthcare Center was targeted, in particular.

"The continuous targeting of Stepanakert's medical facilities by the Azerbaijani armed forces once again demonstrates the goal of Azerbaijan's military-political leadership to inflict maximum damage on the civilian population of Artsakh [the Armenian name for Nagorno-Karabakh], especially women and children far away from the frontline," the ministry said.

"This is another manifestation of state terrorism carried out by a country which through the efforts of Turkey has already turned itself into a hub of concentration of international terrorist fighters in the South Caucasus. We emphasize that amid the existential threats the people of Artsakh are facing, the authorities and the Defense Army of Artsakh have the inalienable right to defend their own people and to counterattack the enemy," it added.

The site, buildbackbetter.com,


features only a homepage topped with an image of the former vice president. It says "Biden-Harris Transition" against a solid blue background.

Armenian Genocide Memorials

Desecrated in Lyon France Bans Turkish 'Grey Wolves' Group



LYON — The Armenian Genocide Memorial and the National Armenian Memorial Centre in Décines, France, were desecrated on Sunday, with yellow spray paint inscription of the initials of Turkish President Recep Tayyip Erdogan and signed by the Turkish far-right militant group Grey Wolves.

The CDCA and the House of Armenian Culture in Décines and surrounding areas have filed a lawsuit with the Lyon prosecutor's office for "desecration of monuments dedicated to the memory of the dead," said their lawyer, Nairi Zandourian. "It's horrible what is happening in Nagorno-Karabakh and this war is spreading to France, we have to put an end to it," she added.

The CDCA said in a statement that the desecration "is part of a series of events aimed at terrorizing and intimidating French citizens of Armenian descent."

Hate speech against Armenians has surged amid the ongoing hostilities in

Karabakh, with Turks and Azerbaijanis declaring what they call "a hunt of Armenians" and threatening them. For example, a group of Turks in France attacked Armenians rallying to protest Azerbaijan's aggression against Nagorno-Karabakh, and injured two of the rally-goers with hammers on October 28.

The Mayor of Decines-Charpieu, Laurence Fautre, announced that soldiers were expected in the area to take over the security of the buildings. "We hope (that a statement will be issued) by the Turkish consul in Lyon and that he will send a message of peace," she added.

The French government on Wednesday banned Turkish ultranationalist Grey Wolves group accusing it of leading violent actions and inciting hatred speech in France.

The ban on the Grey Wolves, the militant wing of Turkey's far-right Nationalist Movement Party, was approved during a weekly Cabinet meeting, government spokesperson Gabriel Attal said.

US Suggesting Deployment of Scandinavian Peacekeepers in Nagorno-Karabakh Conflict Zone

WASHINGTON, DC — US National Security Advisor Robert O'Brien suggests deploying Scandinavian peacekeepers in the Nagorno-Karabakh conflict zone.

According to him, any armed peacekeeping force in the conflict zone must not include representatives of the co-chairing countries of the Minsk Group and neighboring countries.

"Any type of interference or peacekeeping role of Turkey is unacceptable for the United States and Armenia," O'Brien said during a meeting with representatives of the Armenian community of California.

"We believe both countries must accept the idea of Scandinavian peacekeepers, and we are working with the Scandinavian governments to form peacekeeping forces that may be deployed in the region to maintain the ceasefire regime," O'Brien said.

On Thursday, Armenian Prime Minister Nikol Pashinyan discussed ways of implementing ceasefire agreements in the Nagorno-Karabakh conflict zone in a telephone conversation with O'Brien. Yerevan said it was initiated by the American side.

According to the Armenian prime minister's press office, during the conversation Pashinyan drew O'Brien's attention to "the fact that in breach of all norms accepted in international relations and ignoring the OSCE (Organization for Security



and Cooperation in Europe) Minsk Group Co-Chairs' efforts, Azerbaijan violated ceasefire agreements three times in a row, including the agreement that was reached most recently in the U.S. capital."

"Pashinyan stressed that Turkey backs Azerbaijan in this matter, and it is impossible to enforce the truce without specifying which side has broken the ceasefire and who is interested in continuing the hostilities," the statement released by the Armenian prime minister's office said.

"The American side gave assurances that they will continue their mediation efforts aimed at achieving a ceasefire and ruling out the involvement of third parties in the conflict," it added.

Azerbaijan Uses White Phosphorus Munitions in Karabakh



YEREVAN (Civilnet) -- A video footage released from Karabakh on Friday shows Azerbaijani forces firing white phosphorus munitions over major forests in the region.

In the video, white phosphorus can be seen falling on trees in a forested area of Karabakh, sparking fears of potential fires.

According to the Protocol III of the Convention on Certain Conventional Weapons, the use of air-dropped incendiary weapons against military objectives within a concentration of civilians is simply prohibited.

Per Reuters, white phosphorus munitions can be used on battlefields to make smoke screens, generate illumination, mark targets or burn bunkers and buildings.

When a white phosphorus shell explodes, the chemical inside reacts with the air, creating a thick white cloud. When it comes in contact with flesh, it can maim and kill by burning to the bone.

"White phosphorous weapons spread burning phosphorous, which burns at over 800 degrees centi grade (about 1,500 degrees fahrenheit), over a wide area, up to several hundred square meters. The burning will continue until the phosphorous has been completely depleted or until it no longer is exposed to oxygen. The weapon has a potential to cause particularly horrific and painful injuries or slow painful death," Peter Herbya, head of International Committee of the Red Cross, had said in an interview.

Armenian Americans Protest Outside SpaceX Headquarters to Denounce Turkish Satellite Launch



HAWTHORNE (KTLA) -- Hundreds of protesters waving Armenian and American flags gathered outside SpaceX headquarters in Hawthorne Thursday, calling on Elon Musk to nix the launch of a satellite they say could aid in war crimes.

"SpaceX is about to launch a satellite for Turkey that has certain cutting edge technology that can be used in war time for more pinpoint accuracy, for more specific types of attacks," said protest organizer Fred Tatlyan.

Demonstrators said they're urging Musk, the CEO of Tesla and space exploration company SpaceX, to halt the November launch of a communications satellite for the government of Turkey, which is currently aiding its ally Azerbaijan in a war against Armenia over the autonomous enclave of Nagorno-Karabakh, also called Artsakh.

"I've always looked up to Elon

Musk. So I'm not here to bash him just yet. But I would hope his morale kicks in and he's on the right side of history right now," Tatlyan said.

Armenian Americans say the technological tool would give Turkey, and subsequently Azerbaijan, an unfair advantage over Armenia while the countries are at war and the people of Nagorno-Karabakh face heavy artillery, rockets and drones.

"If SpaceX launches this satellite into space, it'll give Turkey the capacity and the ability to kill without being checked or stopped by anyone else," protester Harry Barsegian said.

On Wednesday, an Azerbaijani rocket hit a maternity hospital in the disputed border region, an attack the center's chief doctor denounced as "inhumane," according to the Associated Press.

KTLA reached out to SpaceX for comment and had not heard back Thursday afternoon.

Over 100 Members of Congress Push for Artsakh Demining With HALO Trust

WASHINGTON, D.C. — Over 100 members of Congress sent a bipartisan letter to the U.S. Agency for International Development (USAID) in support of humanitarian demining efforts by the HALO Trust in Nagorno Karabakh. The Armenian Assembly of America reports.

"It's clear that more needs to be done to protect the people of Artsakh and bring lasting peace to the region," said Congressman Jim Costa (D-CA). "Demining efforts save lives and this conflict has put thousands at stake. The peace process must resume. I'm hopeful Administrator Barsa will act quickly to fund demining and unexploded ordnance removal in Nagorno Karabakh to prevent avoidable casualties during and after the conflict."


"As an international aid organization dedicated to removing the types of lethal explosive hazards now strewn throughout Nagorno Karabakh, we at HALO hope to see strong US funding to respond to this humanitarian crisis unfolding in the south Caucasus. We greatly appreciate the leadership of Representatives Jim Costa, Devin Nunes, TJ Cox, Gus Bilirakis, Brad Sherman, Bill Johnson, Judy Chu, John Katko, and the many other Members of Congress that signed onto this letter to urge US support," said Chris Whatley, HALO USA Executive Director.

A chilling side effect of the ongoing military assault by Azerbaijan against the people of Nagorno-Karabakh is the increasing quantity of unexploded ordnance, including cluster munitions, present throughout civilian areas. The HALO Trust is a long-time partner of USAID, and Members of Congress are seeking immediate funding to increase its capabilities and conduct emergency activities to protect civilians in the region.

"The ongoing conflict in Nagorno-Karabakh is a humanitarian crisis that needs immediate international attention. In the same breath, it is crucial the US maintain funding for humanitarian demining in the region. We should not have to fight tooth and nail for peace and basic human rights. I am proud to join my bipartisan colleagues in highlighting this need to USAID," stated Rep. TJ Cox (D-CA).

"I've been to Nagorno-Karabakh and I've seen the amazing work HALO has done to remove mines and UXO to make this land safe to live on again. This work is only more important now as Azerbaijan continues to attack civilian areas in Nagorno-Karabakh. The US must continue our support for this life-saving work to clear the lethal debris of Azerbaijan's hostility," said Rep. Judy Chu.

Over \$164 Million Donated to Hayastan All Armenian Fund



Armenians worldwide have donated over \$164 million for humanitarian and economic aid to war-torn Nagorno-Karabakh provided by Hayastan All Armenian fund.

The Yerevan-based charity launched an international fundraising campaign immediately after the outbreak of the Armenian-Azerbaijani war in and around Karabakh on September 27. Hundreds of thousands of Armenians from around the world have responded to its appeal for urgent aid to Karabakh and its population severely affected by the fighting.

Data released by Hayastan Fund on Wednesday shows that the charity supported by the Armenian government has raised nearly half of the money from the United States. Armenia is the second largest source of the donations to Karabakh, having contributed a third of the total sum so far.

"According to preliminary estimates, at least half a million people from around the world have participated in this fundraising campaign," Hayk Arshamyan, Armenia Fund's executive director, told RFE/RL's Armenian Service. "But this number will rise significantly after we process all

data. This is a quite lengthy process."

The single largest donation worth \$10 million has been made by the U.S.-based Armenian General Benevolent Union.

Hayastan has also received \$3.5 million from Eduardo Eurnekian, an Argentine billionaire businessman of Armenian descent. Russian-Armenian tycoon Samvel Karapetian and two Armenian-American benefactors have contributed \$3 million each.

Arshamyan said that a large part of the sum raised by the Fund is already being spent for humanitarian purposes in coordination with the Armenian government. That includes relief aid provided to Karabakh civilians displaced by the fighting, he said.

According to authorities in Stepanakert, some 90,000 Karabakh Armenians making up around 60 percent of the territory's population have fled their homes. They have been relocated to other parts of Karabakh or taken refuge in Armenia.

Stepanakert, virtually all other Karabakh towns and dozens of villages have been heavily shelled by Azerbaijani forces for the past month. The shelling has caused extensive damage to many homes and public infrastructures.

about the following," the prime minister said. "Mercenaries, Islamic terrorists and Israel are now on the same side basically. So Israel should think, is this really a convenient position for it to be?"

Israel should also ponder, he made clear, whether it really wants to be on the same side in the conflict as Turkey, which has moved thousands of Syrian mercenaries into Azerbaijan to fight against Nagorno-Karabakh.

Pashinyan said the involvement of Turkey and Syrian mercenaries in the conflict has badly complicated the situation: "Their presence in the region poses a threat not only to Nagorno-Karabakh, but also Iran has stated that it views it as a threat, and Russia has stated that it views it as a threat."

The Armenian prime minister said that while in the past there was only indirect evidence that Turkey was mobilizing Syrian mercenaries to fight in Azerbaijan, now there is concrete evidence since two mercenaries were recently captured by Nagorno-

Karabakh forces.

"One of them has testified comprehensively, and said that he was living in a Turkish-controlled Syrian refugee camp. He described how he was recruited, described where they became engaged, and how they crossed the border into Turkey at an official check point, but without anyone asking them any questions or checking them."

Pashinyan said that the world needs to look at this new activity by Turkey and draw the necessary conclusions, because it will use this new way of implementing its foreign policy elsewhere as well, he predicted.

"Israel should ask itself the question – is it not fighting de facto alongside mercenaries against Nagorno-Karabakh? Is this a convenient position for it? If it is, God be with it. But I think that there will be specific consequences, and you will have to face those consequences."

Pashinyan said it was only a matter of time before Turkey's "imperialistic ambition" will be aimed toward Israel.

Bodies of 29 Killed Soldiers Handed Over to Armenia



YEREVAN — The bodies of 29 Armenian servicemen killed in action during the ongoing hostilities in Nagorno-Karabakh have been handed over to the Armenian side, Armenia's Defense Ministry said on Thursday.

According to Defense Ministry spokesperson Shushan Stepanian, the transfer took place on October 29 "with the exceptional mediation efforts of the Russian Federation, and with the participation of the field team of the Personal Representative of the OSCE Chairperson-in-Office and the International Committee of the Red Cross (ICRC)."

She said that at the same time the ICRC efforts have resulted in one civilian's repatriation to Armenia.

"In its turn, the Armenian side, adhering to the arrangements reached within the framework of the humanitarian ceasefire, once again reiterates its readiness to hand over to the


Azerbaijani side the bodies of Azerbaijani servicemen in the territory of Artsakh [Nagorno-Karabakh—ed.], and to start the process of recovery of bodies in the inter-positional zone throughout the entire Artshakh-Azerbaijan frontline of hostilities, as well as exchange of information on POWs and their respective handover in future," Stepanian wrote in a Facebook post.

Earlier today the Defense Ministry of Nagorno-Karabakh confirmed the deaths of 51 more Armenian soldiers, taking its military death toll to 1,116 since fighting with Azerbaijani forces broke out on September 27.

Azerbaijan does not disclose its military losses, but authorities in Baku say the fighting has killed 69 civilians and wounded 322. Armenian authorities in Nagorno-Karabakh have also reported dozens of civilians killed and wounded since the start of the hostilities.

its of the case," European football's governing body said.

UEFA also said Ibrahimov had violated the basic rules of decent conduct.

It's the second UEFA disciplinary case involving Qarabag since start of Nagorno-Karabakh war in September.

UEFA reprimanded more than 20 players and officials from the club, which has its roots in Nagorno-Karabakh, for making military salutes at a Europa League playoff game in Poland.

The Armenian soccer federation had called on UEFA to remove Qarabag from the competition for Ibrahimov's comments "calling to kill all the Armenians, old and young, without distinction."

Book Review – Soul-Searching Thoughts by Rev. Dr. Vahan H. Tootikian

He has done it again!

What you hold in your hands is the 44th volume authored by Rev. Dr. Vahan H. Tootikian since the first one saw the light in 1980. An average of one book a year.

Rev. Dr. Tootikian is not a novelist, nor a fiction writer. His energy does not flow in a commercial sense and understanding. He does not pursue ‘best-seller’ standings nor the material wealth that follows suit.

Why does he write, you might ask. “I write because I believe I have a moral obligation to use my God-given talent, humble as it is, to reach out and touch other lives” is his simple answer. “And reach out he does.

What strikes me about the 44th volume that Rev. Dr. Tootikian has penned is his disciplined mind. Whether in the process of determination to write, the choice of topics or the act of composing, the author reveals a sound empathy and principled judgement of what he needs to say and what applies to enlighten, teach, educate and train the reader.


A breakdown of this volume’s content reveals the many professional roles that the author -a renowned minister, lecturer, administrator, scholar, prolific writer and community leader- has taken on in the book. I will highlight but a few of the roles leaving others for the reader to recognize and enjoy.

THE PREACHER

Rev. Dr. Tootikian has served God in the Christian ministry for 62 years. Shepherding flocks around the globe, Rev. Dr. Tootikian’s passion and primary calling is to disseminate the Word of God. He describes his journey in life as... “There is no vocation or calling more rewarding and satisfying and yet more demanding and challenging than Christian ministry.” It is revealing that imbedded in this bilingual book -30 articles in English and 17 in Armenian- from the first article in English, “How to Observe the New Year”, to the last one in Armenian, eulogizing the prominent poet, Jacque Hagopian, he cries out the compelling message of a Christ-centered or Christ-driven life. As he runs his soul-searching race, his messages come in the form of sermons, “God of the Second Chance,” Bible studies, “Chains of Freedom” or lectures on human morality, “The Yes in No.

THE TEACHER

Along with the good shepherd, Rev. Dr. Tootikian’s race in life has been one of a valuable, treasured and rich experience in church administration, scholarly teaching, community leadership, church history and other fields. This volume brings the heart, mind and soul of the teacher to the reader in a simple textbook style, answering hard questions such as defining success; “You Don’t Have to Win,” defeating pessimism with hope, “What To Say to Pessimists,” promoting social justice, “If the Prophets Were



Here Today,” and bolstering lay ministry in the church, “Ministry in the Armenian Evangelical Church.” These are just a few of the boldly and courageously expressed positions from a man whose heart floods with the reflective love of God.

ARMENIAN CHRISTIAN IDENTITY

Without mincing words, Rev. Dr. Tootikian acknowledges that ethnic identity is a gift that human beings are born in, genealogically inherit and bear its stamp. He clearly asserts that the Armenian Christian identity is a gift from the Creator and has been an inspiration in his life and in the soul-searching thoughts he shares in this book. He cautions though, that an inherited Christian identity cannot substitute for a cognitive acceptance of Christ as a personal savior. Identifying with Christianity requires a conscious acknowledgment, devotion, loyalty and a commitment, often misconstrued by many.

Loyal to his ethnic identity, Rev. Dr. Tootikian is a veteran leader in the global Armenian Evangelical Church, the Armenian Missionary Association of America and the Armenian Evangelical World Council, representing these organizations in interdenominational, ecclesiastical and pan Armenian platforms. The institutions he has diligently served, founded and led in a lifetime of service are the subject of his attention, care and focus. Whether religious or national, Rev. Dr. Tootikian is alert to introduce current historical milestones stirring and inviting attention, sharing soul-searching thoughts and celebrating the occasions. For example, The Centennial of the Treaty of Sevres, the 175th anniversary of the Evangelical Church of Armenia and the Armenian Evangelical World Council are all under the periscope in this volume.

THE EVANGELIST

Sixty-two years ago, a young Vahan Tootikian, heeding to a call from God, dedicated himself to the Lord and entered into discipleship. Before departing this world, Jesus Christ called on His disciples “...therefore go and make disciples of all nations. ”Reflecting God’s love on fellow men and disseminating the Good News of the promise of salvation is every faithful Christian’s responsibility. In a lifetime of service in the

Dr. Zeynep Gürsel to speak on “Portraits of Unbelonging: Photography, the Ottoman State and Armenians Leaving for America 1896-1908”

Dr. Zeynep Devrim Gürsel, associate professor of Anthropology at Rutgers University, will give a Zoom presentation on “Portraits of Unbelonging: Photography, the Ottoman State and Armenians Leaving for America 1896-1908” at 7:00PM on Thursday, November 12, 2020. The presentation is part of the Fall 2020 Lecture Series of the Armenian Studies Program and is supported by the Leon S. Peters Foundation. All Lecture Series events will take place online, and not face-to-face, through the Fall 2020 semester.

Portraits of Unbelonging investigates the history of Armenian emigration from the Ottoman empire to the United States from the politically fraught and often violent 1890s to the end of Abdülhamid II’s reign in 1909. Between 1896 and 1909, Ottoman Armenian subjects could emigrate legally only if they renounced their nationality and promised to never return to the empire. Having their photograph taken was a key step in the process. These photos recorded their severance from Ottoman nationality and became one of the first uses of photography to police borders anywhere in the world.

The goal of Portraits of Unbelonging is to link an Ottoman Armenian past to an American future to create a double-sided history of migration. Gürsel follows the stories of emigrant families over a century through official documents, ship manifests, and family photo al-

bums. This involves traveling all around the United States – she has visited several Fresno families – to meet with descendants of those photographed and hear what became of the families first encountered in the Ottoman archives.

Dr. Gürsel is a media anthropologist and Associate Professor in the Department of Anthropology at Rutgers University. She is the author of *Image Brokers: Visualizing World News in the Age of Digital Circulation* (Univ. of California Press, 2016) and the director of the ethnographic film *Coffee Futures* (2009).

mine who will serve as the next President of the United States. Votes are still being counted in several states around the country,” an unsigned message on the site says.

“The crises facing the country are severe — from a pandemic to an economic recession, climate change to racial injustice — and the transition team will continue preparing at full speed so that the Biden-Harris Administration can hit the ground running on Day One.”

Trump has not conceded defeat and Biden has not quite clinched victory as absentee ballots are counted in remaining swing states.

If Biden prevails, he will be the oldest president to take office when

he’s sworn in as the 46th president on Jan. 20. He turns 78 this month. His running mate, Sen. Kamala Harris (D-Calif.), will be the second non-white vice president and the first women of African and Indian ancestry.

“It is clear that we’re winning enough states to reach 270 electoral votes needed to win the presidency. I’m not here to declare that we’ve won. But I am here to report that when the count is finished, we believe we will be the winners,” Biden said Wednesday afternoon in a six-minute speech in Wilmington, Del., with Harris standing nearby.
